## THE HARTLEY MORRIS MEN

2004 marks the 70<sup>th</sup>. anniversary of the formation of the Morris Ring – the National Association of Men's Morris and Sword Clubs, which exists to preserve and perform these traditional dances – and also of Hartley's progenitor, the late Stansted Morris Men.

Sadly, World War II put an end to all organised morris dancing in England – but, once it was over, the Morris Ring grew and prospered, and today embraces some 260 active clubs all over the civilised (i.e. beer-drinking) world.

The Stansted Morris Men, on the other hand, did not survive the war, but in 1952 they metamorphosed into the Hartley Morris Men and as such have been dancing regularly in Kent ever since. Thus it is that two years ago we celebrated the 50th. anniversary of our formation, but this year – like the Morris Ring – we celebrate the 70th. anniversary of our foundation.

For this reason our Mayday tour has particular significance. After our traditional celebration of Beltane at dawn at the Coldrum Long Barrow, we will be joined by the Wadard Morris Men who now practice in the village of Hartley from whence we originally came. Our next joint stop is Farningham where we were based throughout the 1970's and where Wadard were formed by some Hartley members who got left behind when we moved to our present base in Wrotham 25 years ago.

Lunchtime will be spent in Stansted, the village of our foundation, with a token dance outside Goodmans Barn where the Stansted Morris Men first practised. After a ritualistic blessing of the local Mayqueen, we round off the day at our 'spiritual' home, The Rose & Crown, Wrotham, having come full circle as it was in this village the Stansted Morris Men regularly danced during the 1930's (top picture, front cover).
