Morris dancing has been a part of this country's heritage for hundreds of years. Following a period of decline the tradition was luckily saved from near extinction in the early years of the last century and experienced a revival after the Great War.

In 1934 a group of local men got together and founded The Stansted Morris Men. Following a break in their activities during the last war, a number of them reformed in 1952 as The Hartley Morris Men. Today we continue that tradition of maintaining a part of English culture as our members and forbears have done locally for at least the past 74 years. Based in Wrotham for the last 3 decades we maintain our allegiance to the populace of villages and towns in Kent with occasional invitations to perform at points westward or maybe even across the Thames.

The year 1934 also saw the formation of a national association of men's Morris clubs, to be known as 'The Morris Ring', with the objective of maintaining the tradition and performances of the Morris in its various forms, and bringing it to a wider audience. The current Morris Ring organisation, of which Hartley is a full member, is run by a Squire, Bagman and Treasurer and has over two hundred independent Member and Associate teams.

The Squire (or 'Head') of The Morris Ring serves for two years and is elected by the members of Morris sides from all over the country. So it is with some pride for us that the newly elected Squire to be taking office later this year is a long standing member of the Hartley Morris Men. Our very own Brian Tasker will be dancing into office at the Dartington Ring Meeting in September. This will be the second Ring Meeting that Hartley Morris Men will be attending during the year as we have also been invited to the Liverpool meeting in July.

Generally four to five weekend Ring Meetings are held every year in various parts of the country. These are formal gatherings of up to 200 Morris men organised by individual Morris clubs who arrange displays in their local area. Hartley Morris Men have hosted three Ring Meetings based in Wrotham in 1982, 1992 & 2002 and co-hosted one in Tonbridge during 2007. Our next one is planned for 2012. In addition we hold an annual weekend 'Ale' in Wrotham which is regularly attended by around 70 of the country's finest dancers and singers. And why do we do it? Well we enjoy keeping a bit of English culture alive and we enjoy the pleasure it brings to our audiences.



We hope that you will share in the good luck which the Morris brings by contributing to our 'bag'.

We practise in Wrotham at St Georges Hall on Thursday evenings throughout the winter months. If you are interested in taking it up as a hobby please come along to our 'Informal Taster Evening' on September 18th in St Georges Hall, Wrotham at 8.30pm. Everyone welcome. Wassail.
