In 1934, before the days of soaps on television, a group of local men got together to pass their spare time in the evenings by forming the Stansted Morris Men. The same year, in Thaxted, near the other Stansted, six existing Morris teams (or sides) founded the Morris Ring, the National Association of Men's Morris & Sword Dance Clubs.

In 1939 Mr Hitler's ambitions rather curtailed most Morris clubs activities including those of the Stansted men who nevertheless reformed and metamophasised in 1952 as the Hartley Morris Men taking the colours Red, White & Blue in recognition of the Queen's accession to the throne. Indeed, on the front of this very document is pictured our very own Brian Tasker, resplendent in our kit, dancing in as Squire of the Morris Ring at Dartington last year. Hatless, the more observant will notice, not due to the wind but because he is dancing a solo jig.

This year, to celebrate our joint 75th anniversary, Hartley Morris Men are proud to be hosting the 318th Meeting of the Morris Ring over the weekend 12-14 June when some 120 dancers will be based in the village of Wrotham, which we adopted as our 'spiritual'* home some 31 years ago. *(spiritual – as in the Rose & Crown, where all the singing will take place on the Friday and Saturday evenings when spirits will be duly exercised).

The rest of the year we maintain the traditionally English custom of Morris dancing by performing most Thursday evenings during the summer outside some of the finest pubs in Kent, as listed in this brochure. Throughout the winter we practise every Thursday evening in St Georges Hall, Wrotham, where similarly minded men wishing to adopt our lifestyle are welcome to join us. In fact at the beginning of September, in conjunction with Invicta Ladies Morris, we will be holding a 'taster' evening for all-comers wanting to try the Morris. It costs nothing, keeps you fit and young at heart so come along and give it a go; any of our men will be pleased to talk to you about their experiences of being a Morris dancer and give you more details about joining a Morris side.



We hope that you will share in the good luck which the Morris brings by contributing to our 'bag'.

We practise in Wrotham at St George's Hall on Thursday evenings throughout the winter months. If you are interested in taking it up as a hobby please come along to our 'Informal Taster Evening' on September 24th in "St George's" Hall, Wrotham at 8.30pm. Everyone welcome. Wassail.
